

Position on Xinjiang

Berlin, August 2020

German business is following the reports on the Xinjiang Autonomous Region with great concern and takes the allegations mentioned in the reports seriously. Human rights are a universal good and are non-negotiable. German companies are aware of their societal responsibility, and this applies to all company locations worldwide.

Almost all internationally active German companies have globally valid standards of conduct in which they commit themselves and their partners to respecting human rights. Many companies commit themselves to or are guided by international codes of conduct, such as the UN Global Compact. Companies make these commitments in their own interest and follow processes developed for this purpose to monitor compliance.

APA supports a coordinated approach by governments and parliaments in EU member states and EU institutions in order to end forced internment, forced detention and forced labor in factories of Uyghurs and other ethnic minorities in China. We call on policymakers to clearly address any shortcomings in the protection of human rights in China and worldwide.

Creating transparency is an important confidence-building measure. The Chinese government should therefore grant independent bodies access to all facilities in Xinjiang province that have come under criticism. It should ratify and implement the ILO conventions on forced labor.

German business continues to rely on dialogue with China and the expansion of its presence in the Chinese market. The aim is to play a responsible role in shaping conditions locally, insofar as this is within the scope of the companies' possibilities. This also applies to the involvement of German companies in Xinjiang.
